I started in 2001 with my then colleague Mina Farenza–West, with whom I'd previously worked in palliative care. When she left, I promised her I'd nurture the Cherry Lodge dream she and Margaret shared to the best of my ability. I hope that's what I've done. I've learned so many things over the years, many of which a textbook can never teach you – like the fact that

everything we achieve is as part of a team, where everyone has a role to play. The world of cancer is constantly changing, and people are now able to live with their disease for many years. I came from many years in palliative care and had to rethink my views - people do survive this disease and live well.

My best memories of life at Cherry Lodge are the laughter, the tears and the caring for each other. I've loved being able to develop new projects without lots of red tape, working with fantastic volunteers and celebrating when members are in remission and able to get on with their lives once again. WHAT CHERRY LODGE MEANS TO ME

The members are what Cherry Lodge is all about. Poet Dennis Evans, 91, has been a Cherry Lodge member since completing treatment for prostate cancer 13 years ago. Here he explains what that has meant to him.

The charity has played a hugely important part in my life, and I'll be eternally grateful. My cancer diagnosis 15 years ago came as a complete shock, and my life was turned upside down. Two years of intensive treatment was very hard, and I was left struggling financially. Even worse was the isolation. Back then, no-one spoke about prostate cancer, and although the doctors were kind, no support was offered when I'd finished treatment.

But then I heard about Cherry Lodge through a Macmillan nurse, and all that changed. Since then, I've received support from Cherry Lodge in many wonderful ways, from financial advice to healing, massage and acupuncture. But perhaps the most important aspect has been the companionship and sense of community. Much as I enjoy writing poetry, it can be rather solitary, and I can't overestimate the importance of meeting others who've lived through similar experiences to me at the Drop-In sessions at Cherry Lodge. Everyone is welcome and you can join in conversations or just sit quietly. It sounds so ordinary, but it's been so important to me, especially since I lost my partner two years ago.

At the time of my diagnosis, my odds weren't great. But here I am, 15 years later, still enjoying life thanks - in part, at least, to Cherry Lodge.

The Cherry Lodge family is full of fascinating individuals – Dennis' life journey led from apprentice engineer to celebrated poet.

I worked as an engineer until I was 50, when an economic downturn left me out of work and wondering what to do next. Having written for many years, I was offered a teaching job at the Worker Education Association and since then several collections of my poetry have been published. My poetry has also been set to music and performed at Sadler's Wells and I've performed at venues including The Edinburgh Fringe and Millennium Dome in 2000. Last autumn The Royal Society of Arts invited me to display some of my poems at their HQ in John Adam Street, London, which was a great honour.
